DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

Week 1

Genesis 1-24; Psalm 1-7

- 1. What words are frequently repeated in Genesis 1? What does this repetition suggest about God?
- 2. In what ways is man made differently from the rest of creation? Why is this significant?
- 3. Why did Eve eat fruit from the "Tree of the Knowledge of Good and Evil" despite God's instruction not to eat it? (Genesis 3:6)
- 4. Why did God send Adam & Eve out of the Garden? (Genesis 3:22-23)
- 5. What specific promises does God make to Abraham?
- 6. Genesis 15:6 says, Abraham "believed" God, and He (God) credited it to him as "righteousness." What did Abraham believe? Why would this "belief" please God?
- 7. Circumcision—ouch! Yeah we're going there. Of all the outward "signs" of being incovenant, why might God haven chosen circumcision?
- 8. Abraham's servant is sent to find a wife for Isaac. In light of the servant's prayer (Genesis 24:12-14), what character qualities is the servant wanting to see in the potential bride?
- 9. In this week's reading, where do we see examples of mankind's sinful tendencies?
- 10. In this week's reading, where do we see examples of God's love for mankind?

- 3. In Genesis 2:15, God places Adam and Eve in the garden to "cultivate and keep" it (NASB95). Compare with other English translations. What is the essential idea behind each word?
