

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

Week 18

Isaiah 45 - 66 | Psalm 119:33 - 121

1. How many times does God repeat “I am the Lord, and there is no other” in Isaiah 45? What are some of the other things we are prone to turn to when searching for “righteousness and strength.” (Vs. 24)
2. Isaiah 46:3-4 tells us that from the womb until our old age God remains the same— and He made us, carries us, bears us, and rescues us. How does this knowledge encourage us to hold fast Jesus times of trial and uncertainty?
3. Read Isaiah 46:8-10. How should the fact that God’s plans will take place, and that He will do all He wills comfort you? How should it challenge us to surrender our lives to his will?
4. What blessings would have come if the people would have “paid attention” to God’s commandments in Isaiah 48:17-19?
5. Isaiah 53 is a familiar prophesy of Jesus Christ’s sacrifice for us. Vs 10-12 highlight His willingness to carry our iniquities and submit to death for our benefit. What does this teach us about God’s character as well as our value before him?
6. What picture from nature is given in Isaiah 55:10-11 to illustrate God’s ability to accomplish what He pleases?
7. What are some of the details of the New Creation given in Isaiah 65:17-25?
8. The Psalmist asks for their heart to be turned to God’s decrees and their eyes to be turned away from what is worthless (Psalm 119:36-37). How can those two things work to turn us away from disgrace (vs. 39)?

Prayer Prompt Ideas

Pick your favorite portion of Psalm 119 to pray over your life and the lives of your family.

Pray Psalm 119:165 “Abundant peace belongs to those who love your instruction, nothing makes them stumble.”

Pray for God’s abundant peace to fill you as you go through this week. Pray for a true and abiding love for his instruction that will keep you from stumbling.
