Week 20

Jonah 1 - Job 3 | Psalm 129 - 135

Jonah

1. Is there anything you can personally relate to in Jonah's prayer from Chapter 2?
2. What does Jonah teach us about God's compassion as well as our capacity to judge and condemn others?

Micah

3. What will take place in the last days according to Micah 4:1-8?
4. What does Micah 7:18-20 teach us about God's character?

Nahum

6. Nahum 1:7 says, "The Lord is good, a stronghold in a day of distress, He cares for those who take refuge in Him." This verse comes immediately after God's vengeance is described. What does it mean for you that God is perfectly just while also merciful, good, kind, and loving, and that the door to Him is always open?

Habbakuk

7. What stands out to you from Habakkuk's prayers? (1:1-4; 1:12-17; 3:1-15)

Zephaniah

8. What will happen as God restores His people in Zephaniah 3:9-20?

Job

9. How is Job described in Job 1:1-3? How does he respond to Satan's first test in 1:21? How does his response challenge you?

Prayer Prompt: Read Psalm 130: 3-4. Spend time thanking God for His total forgiveness—that He does not keep an account of our iniquities. Remember from this week's reading, that in each prophesy for destruction God's mercy, protection, and forgiveness was available if the people chose to turn back to Him. Celebrate the time in your life when God called you to Himself and pray for a soft heart that thirsts after righteousness.
